


Sandygate care home

Gardens for all seasons

The gardens provide a space for residents to enjoy nature and the outdoors.

Designed with accessibility in mind, they feature raised beds where residents can grow vegetables and see the fruits of their labours used in the kitchen, promoting wellbeing and connection to green care.

Seasonal events, including summer BBQs, outdoor tea parties, and music therapy sessions, bring the community together, while quiet corners offer space for reflection and relaxation. The garden is also home to our rabbit, Flowers. She often has free roam of the garden area and is popular with everyone at the home, including visiting families and friends.

A travelling zoo visits every three months, bringing a range of animals for residents to interact with. These visits, along with the garden's natural visitors, create moments of joy and connection.

Our garden isn't just an outdoor space - it's a place where life flourishes, memories are made, and connections grow.

A taste of home

Our mealtimes are about more than just food - they're an opportunity to connect, enjoy favourite dishes, and celebrate life's little moments.

The head chef, leads the team with creativity and passion, preparing seasonal menus that residents help shape.

Special occasions and themed days, such as Burns Night and Chinese New Year, add excitement and variety to dining. Residents can also participate in weekly baking classes, where they create treats like scones and pizzas, sparking fond memories and providing opportunities to engage.

A great deal of anticipation surrounds the themed birthday cakes, the design is tailored to reflect the resident's interests. Past cakes have been shaped like keyboards, pigeons, and Kit Kats. One particularly memorable cake was for a resident's 100th birthday, beautifully adorned with her favourite flowers.

The dining experience at Sandygate combines high-quality, freshly prepared meals with a welcoming environment where residents feel cared for and valued. Whether it's a hearty dinner or an afternoon tea, every meal at Sandygate is a moment to savour.
